Kia ora,

The Otago Community Hospice relies upon the generosity of its community to keep its free service supporting people, with terminal illness to live and die well.

We are always refining our services so we can do more with less, however our region's footprint is large and our community's needs are increasingly complex. We support around 222 Otago people in need of palliative care at any given time, with more than 749 patients cared for each year. The Hospice receives around 56% of its funding from the Government and the remaining 44% is raised in the community. That equates to fundraising \$2.5 million from our community each year.

We have a really small fundraising team and are reliant on our community running fundraising initiatives on our behalf. We wanted to ensure you had a Tool Kit to help you out. Fundraising can seem daunting at first, but you'll find lots of inspiration, tips and all the ways we can support you. Did you know?...

Hospice Services are free.

- Hospice care has a unique whole person approach (covering physical, spiritual, emotional and social needs) delivered by a specialist multidisciplinary team.
- Hospice care also wraps around family/whanau, providing ongoing support and education.
- The Otago Community Hospice services include: 24/7 advice and support for patients, families and primary palliative care providers; inpatient care; community care coordination; night care service; outpatient clinics; counselling; social work; bereavement and spiritual support for patients/families/whānau;
- For most of our patients, OCH care and support happens at home. Some patients, whose needs are highly complex, will be admitted to the inpatient unit (23% of our patients).
- Otago Community Hospice has community teams in South Otago, Central Otago, North Otago and Dunedin.

YOUR IMPACT

Where does my fundraised money go?

Otago Community Hospice receives partial funding from Government; but financial support from the community is essential to meet the shortfall of \$2.5million – that equals \$6850 raised each day of the year.
